### Homework

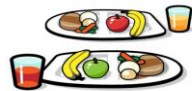
**Can you make or draw a model river, it's up to you how you do it, maybe you could even add labels- to be completed by next week**

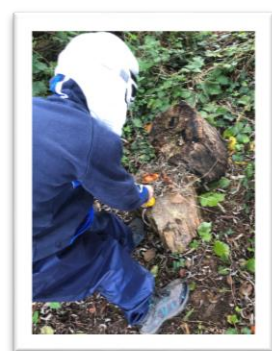
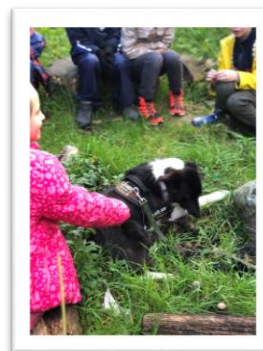
We have a very exciting and busy week next week with our CAP workshops and compost workshops. We can't wait to tell you all about them.
