HOME LEARNING

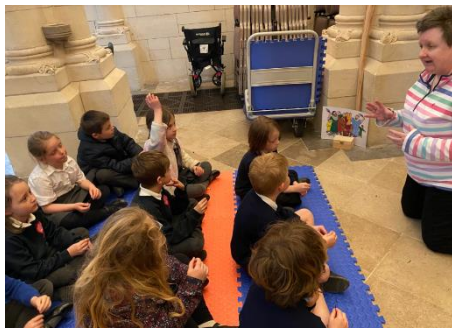
Home learning consists of reading Maths and curriculum themed projects.

I have sent home the children some handwriting that they can practice on the sheet and bring back to show me if they want 😊

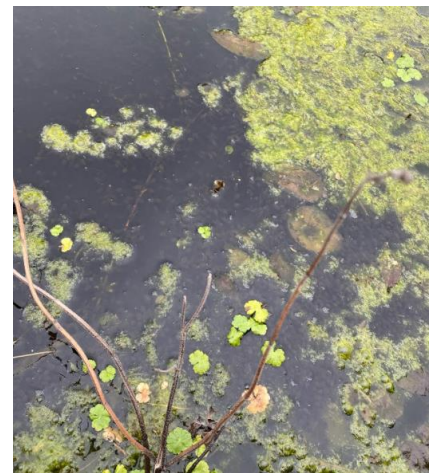


Dear all,
