This Week in Croft

In Maths, we have begun a unit on Geometry looking at angles. We have learned all about the different types of angles there are and how to measure them with a protractor. We then used our knowledge of right angles and half turns to calculate the value of missing angles. Croft really enjoyed this as it has the element of a puzzle about it.



In Art, we have started exploring the artist Paul Klee and the artistic movement Cubism. We studied some of Paul Klee's works and looked for different geometric shapes within his painting and tried to draw some of our own.

We have started reading our class novel. Croft so enjoyed 'The House with Chicken legs,' that they asked me to read another by the same Author. So we have begun reading 'The Castle of Tangled Magic' by Sophie Anderson. This tells of a girl who lives in a magical castle, who steps through a door into another land. We are already hooked!



In P.E, the wonderful Miss Worden has started our training for sports day. This term we will be focussing on athletics. In our session this week, we learnt all about sprinting and long jump. We practised driving with our knees and pumping our arms to improve our speeds. We then found out how we can use our body weight to increase the distance of our jumps. I was so impressed by how far they could jump, nothing under two metres. Next week, we will be coached in different kinds of throws.

In R.E., we are discussing the meaning of betrayal in connection with the betrayal of Jesus by Peter. We thought about time when we may have felt betrayed and how we reacted. We then looked at how Jesus forgave Peter and thought about how we could include that value in our own lives.
