## **Information for Parents**

### **Healthy Start Scheme**



If you're more than ten weeks pregnant or have a child under four years old, and receive certain benefits, you may be entitled to get help to buy healthy food and milk.

If you're eligible, you'll be sent a Healthy Start card with money added every four weeks that you can use in some UK shops.

You can use your card to buy cow's milk; fresh, frozen, and tinned fruit and vegetables; fresh, dried, and tinned pulses and infant formula milk based on cow's milk.

You can also use your card to collect Healthy Start vitamins to support you during pregnancy and breastfeeding, and vitamin drops for babies and young children - suitable from birth to four years old.

### **Has your income changed?**

If your family income has changed and you are struggling to pay food bills, we encourage you to [check your eligibility and apply for free school meals.](#)

All children in reception, year 1 and year 2 at state schools in England automatically get free school meals. From year 3 onwards, children whose parents are receiving any of a range of benefits are entitled to free school meals during term time.

### **Support with meals during the school holidays**

Families eligible for benefits-related free school meals will also [receive supermarket vouchers](#) to help pay for their food shopping at a range of supermarkets for six weeks over the summer holidays.

Parents and carers of children currently receiving benefits-related free school meals have been sent a letter or email with information about how to access their vouchers.
