This week as scientists we made some predictions before our experiment to see how we think germs are spread. We had a bowl of water, some pepper, some hand sanitiser and some washing-up liquid. We then had to put our finger in the pepper and predict what was going to happen. We then put some washing-up liquid and had to predict what would happen then. We found that the pepper spread out and dispersed with the washing-up liquid which showed how germs spread out when you have clean fingers.
