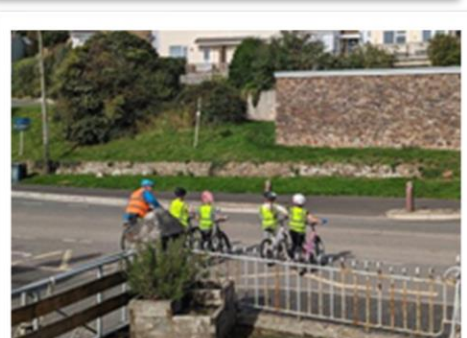
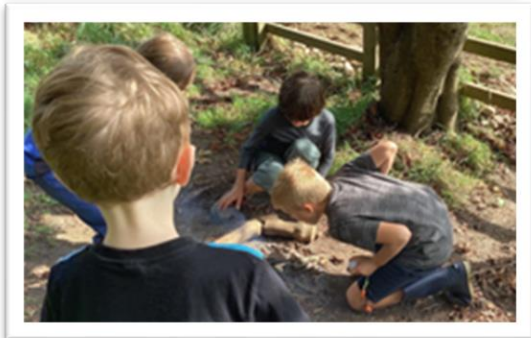
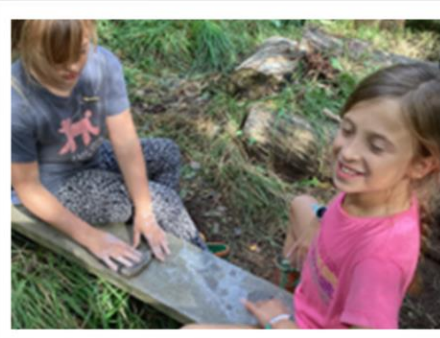
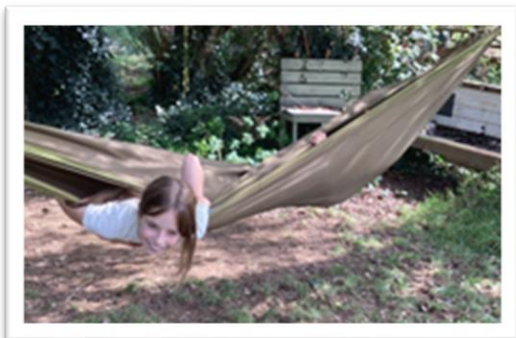
Dear Families,

As scientists this week we conducted an experiment to show us how our bones are protected in our bodies. We used an egg to represent our bones and shook it in a glass jar, we then added water to the glass jar and found that the egg took longer to crack.
