As scientists, our curiosity led us to explore the principles of floating and sinking, delving into the underlying reasons behind these phenomena. Through a comparative test, we sorted materials based on their buoyancy, distinguishing between those that float and those that sink.

In mathematics, we've embarked on a journey into fractions, with a particular focus on halves this week. Meanwhile, our geographical explorations of the British Isles have taken us to Northern Ireland and Wales, where we've uncovered the diverse physical features including mountains, lakes, and meandering rivers.

In our Design and Technology lessons, we've been experimenting with folding, creating tubes, and exploring various methods of joining materials as we develop our skills in preparation for constructing our very own bridges.

In music, our weekly lessons with Mrs. Bickle have been a delight. The children have been immersed in playing a variety of percussion instruments, synchronizing their rhythms to the beat of the music, fostering their musical talents and appreciation.
