Next week, **Wednesday 3rd July,** will be our last Forest School session of the year. We are hoping to have a whole school walk to the estuary in the morning (weather depending) and cook some vegetable kebabs on

our campfire in the afternoon. Please can all children bring some cut-up vegetables they wish to use for their kebabs. We will provide the skewers. Year 4 have their final sailing session in the morning but will join us for the campfire in the afternoon.

Start Point

We now have chrysalides and hopefully soon we will see butterflies emerge. The sound of hammering rang through the school this week as the children explored our new woodworking tools. They have been designing and making a variety of things from planes to cars; using hand drills, saws, measuring tapes and hammers. As historians, we have been learning about how the Great Fire of London was put out and comparing their firefighting equipment with that of modern firefighting techniques. As mathematicians, we have been exploring volume and capacity, and the children have used water and different-sized containers to consolidate their learning. We have been very busy practicing the show. We would like the children in Start Point to wear a plain black/dark top and trousers. We will be making animal masks at school for them to wear. Finally, Mrs Thomas brought in her 2 tortoises for us to see. We learnt about what they like to eat and how to care for them. The children searched the adventure area to look for food to feed them with.
