## Start Point

*Starpoint have continued their learning about Australia by comparing New South Wales to Devon and Sydney to Plymouth. The children noticed many similarities and differences. In computing, we finished our learning on robotics by programming simple algorithms into BeeBot robots and making them go round a specific route. The children debugged their programming to make sure the BeeBots ended up in the*

right place! Some of the children have been making posters to celebrate England's football achievements in the Euros, I think they have brought us good luck so far! We have been continuing to practise for the show and the children are excited to wear their costumes next week.

Croft have continued their work on Egypt in Geography and have consolidated their knowledge into a poster advertising the benefits of Egypt in comparison to the UK. We looked at data regarding the climate & weather in both countries & many of the children were quick to spot the difference in sunshine levels! We also examined the data on the population of both countries and again, the children interpreted the data well to notice that the World's population has increased considerably in recent years. We have also continued our work in French on verbs such as to sing, to dance, to play an instrument, to skip and to cook and the children have been very confident in constructing sentences in class.
