The children have had a busy week with lots of great learning. As mathematicians, we have been developing our knowledge of subtraction and working out the difference. The Armada was our focus in history, and we wrote articles for 'The Tudor Times' explaining how the Armada was defeated. As scientists, we have explored the structures of different animals including vertebrates and invertebrates. As designers in D&T, we have been investigating different types of puppets.

We will soon be starting to practise for our Nativity so scripts and songs sheet will be sent home. If your child has some lines, please help them to practise.





## Croft

The children have settled straight back into their learning and appeared to enjoy looking at the Grinch during English as we are working at 'saving Christmas' in a persuasive letter. We have looked briefly at the original Christmas miser - 'Scrooge' and have researched a little of Dickens' background to look at the inspiration for his work. We look forward to honing our persuasive skills in the run up to Christmas! Croft have all worked well in History this week where we have been looking at the impact that the arrival of the Windrush and subsequent immigrants had on Britain in the 1950s. Many of the children demonstrated great empathy in understanding what life might have been like in the 1950s and we hope to share some of our work with you in Praise Assembly. In RHE we are looking at Health and Wellbeing this half-term and we tried out some meditation and Yoga as ways of being calm and learning how to help ourselves deal with worries or stresses. Hopefully, we can continue to use these vital skills throughout the rest of the year. In science, Year 5 and 6 made heart models.
