As artists, we have been preparing for our weaving project by planning what we want to weave by looking at the colours in our local environment and matching paint, fabric etc to those colours.

We brought in one of the bicycles from outside to help us determine which materials are used to make a bicycle and why those materials were chosen for certain parts; as we continue our science learning about materials.

In maths, our focus has been on using our number bonds to help us add and subtract numbers.

Beebot robots have been used in our computing lessons as the children learn how to program them and realise how important it is to de bug.

They also looked at tints and shade for different colours. We have continued to work on our non-chronological report and look forward to planning our independent writes next week.

As Geographers we have been learning about latitude and longitude. We learnt how to remember the difference: LAtitude – Lines Around the Earth and LOngitude – Lines Over the top of the Earth! We discussed how it is important to have one system that is followed all over the world because it provides a standardised way to pinpoint any location on Earth, allowing for precise navigation, mapping, and communication of geographical positions across different languages and cultures.


