As artists this week, we have been looking at the foreground, mid-ground and background when painting. During this lesson, we applied our knowledge of creating tints. As writers, we have been using all the skills we have learnt to complete our independent write on an animal that lives in a cold environment. We look forward to sharing some examples with you. As historians we have been looking at a variety of Primary and Secondary sources from the Stone Age and discussing what we think they may be and what they might have been used for. In French, we continue learning about habitats around the world. We have learnt this week about which animals live in each habitat.

positive behaviours in the classroom.




In school, we uphold the four values of honesty, responsibility, respect and friendship. This half term, we have a focus on responsibility.
