#### Start Point

On Wednesday, we had a visit from the author Claire Helen Welsh who shared her new book 'The Space Between' with us. The children got to play some games related to the message in the book and to draw the life cycle of a butterfly with the book's illustrator Fiona Lumbers. After the visit from the weavers last week, the children have started their own weaving project! Christopher Columbus and his journey to the Americas has been our history learning this week as we plot his journey through life on a map starting in Italy and ending up in the Americas.

As scientists, we have been busy exploring sun protection in year 4 where we planned and conducted our own experiment using UV beads and different materials. In Year 5 and 6, we explored shadows and how the position of the light source will change the appearance of the shadow. In writing, we have started to write an adventure story based on Michael Morpurgo's book 'Kensuke's Kingdom'. In our RE lessons, we have been learning about the importance of prayer to Muslims. As Geographers we are learning about the Arctic and Antarctic Circles and were surprised by the fact that during certain times of year they have 24 hours of sunlight or 24 hours of darkness and we thought about the implications that this would have for daily

life.
