### Start Point

So, as scientists they set up a comparative test using marsh mallows and spaghetti (Straw), lolly sticks and tape (sticks) and Lego (bricks) to see which material would be the most suitable. The wolf didn't visit so we used a hairdryer instead!

Lighting fire was a popular activity in forest school this week as the children practised using a fire steel and cotton wool to create a flame on which they toasted marsh mallows!

## Croft

In Writing this week, we have produced some amazing sentences. We listened to the sounds of a storm, to collect a bank of onomatopoeic words to describe the feeling of being in a storm (bang, crash, whoosh). We also learnt how to use pathetic fallacy to give human feelings to something non-human. We used it to describe the weather with human emotions to reflect the mood of the text for example, 'the raindrops wept around him.'

As Historians this week, we learnt about how life has changed throughout the Stone Age. We thought about how life was different in the Mesolithic and Neolithic Ages and what it might be like to have lived during these times.

In French, we completed our end of unit assessment about Habitats and the different animals that live in each habitat. It was a great opportunity to see how much we have learnt over this last term.
